

# Who Are Wee?


Welcome to The Listies' 110% Ready Learning Resource!

## DRAMA

Morning Routine Mirror Game

What a great brain break

#### A Drama game that would make an ideal brain break!

- · Have the class brainstorm a list of tasks that are part of our morning routine
- Choose two students to model how to play the game one will take on the role of 'leader' and the other will be the mirror.
- The leader chooses a routine from the brainstormed list to act out and their partner will copy their actions, as if the leader is looking in a mirror
- Pairs are not allowed to communicate verbally throughout the game
- Students can switch roles each time a new morning routine task is selected
- The game can continue with all students working in pairs to act out morning routine tasks.
- For younger students, a third student can join each group, taking on the role of guessing what task is being acted out

### MATHS 1 Minute Chore Challenge

#### A maths challenge involving measurement of time and big laughs!

Resources: Stop watches or visual timer on interactive whiteboard

- Begin the activity by asking students to think about how long a minute is. Have students stand, then start a hidden timer and have them sit down when they think a minute has passed. This opens up lots of opportunities for discussion comparing time and duration
- Inform students that they are going to challenge themselves to see how many times they
  can carry out repetitive tasks from their morning routine in one minute
- Older students can act as timekeepers, using individual stopwatches, or teachers may wish to display a visual timer on the interactive whiteboard that the whole class can see
- Choose a student to be the first to take on the challenge and ask them to predict how many times they can take their shoes on and off in a minute (adjust the activity for younger children e.g taking socks on and off). Record the prediction, then have the student carry out the task repeatedly while being timed. Was their prediction higher or lower than the original prediction? What could have made the task easier?
- Continue with different tasks, making predictions and comparisons between different activities
- Possible tasks could include: Packing and unpacking your schoolbag, putting your jumper on and taking it off, miming making sandwiches, miming cleaning teeth, miming getting dressed.
- Wrap up the lesson by ordering the tasks completed from least to most. Are there any strategies we could try to increase the number of repetitions achieved? Which task was the easiest? Which was the hardest?

# VISUAL ARTS Sticker Design



#### **D.I.Y Reward Stickers**

Matt is desperate to get his hands on those reward stickers!

Design some stickers to help him get ready quicker! Resources - A4 sheet of circles per student

- Students create their own sticker designs for Matt's sticker chart - remember, gross is good!!
- Brainstorm ideas to support students as needed and look at examples of commercially available reward stickers
- Discuss design elements such as the placement of any text/words and the need to keep pictures and symbols simple, and use of bright colours







Resources: Art materials

- Students create a monster that is made entirely from the mess that could be found in Matt's bedroom – it could be a wet towel zombie or a stinky sock serpent!
- Students draw and label a picture of their monster and share their creation with the class
- For older students create a comic strip with their mess monster as the main character

### Wordplay Workshop



Explore some of the Listies language and create some disgusting new terms!

- Introduce the definition of a portmanteau word a word or part of a word made by combining the spellings and meanings of two or more other words or word parts (such as smog from smoke and fog)
- Other examples of portmanteau words include:
- · Spork
- Emoticon
- Hangry
- · Brunch

Can you think of any others?

- The Listies love to create their own portmanteau words, for example spewtiful (a beautiful spew) - can you come up with any of your own portmanteau words?
   Extra points for lols and grossness
- The Listies have two whole books of made up words! Ickypedia and Ickyfoodia.
